

LUGGAGE POLICY

Crossing to Île aux Lièvres

Each passenger, including children, may bring a **maximum of 2 bags** and must follow these conditions:

- Each bag can weigh up to **20 kg or 45 lb**
 - Including:
 - Personal belongings
 - Food
 - Camping equipment if you are camping
 - Bags must be completely closed to prevent items from falling out (**no reusable grocery bags**)
- Anything carried outside a bag must be firmly attached due to the high risk of breakage or loss. It's better not to leave anything outside.

A small extra item (such as a purse, camera bag, or small backpack) is allowed if kept with you for the crossing.



A \$50 fee for any non-compliant bag must be settled prior to departure.

- You must be able to carry your own luggage to the boat and to your accommodation once you arrive on the island.
- For stays longer than 2 nights, one extra cooler is allowed as long as it can remain on the back deck of the boat, exposed to saltwater.
- Not allowed on deck : soft-sided coolers or coolers containing electronic items that could be damaged by salt.

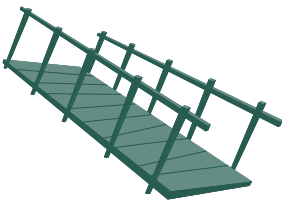
Additional Information



Please note that during extreme weather events (strong winds or heavy rain), you may not be able to collect your luggage yourself. In these conditions, our team will handle the luggage with a focus on speed, for their own safety and to protect the facilities. It is therefore very important that you follow the instructions on the previous page to reduce the risk of damage and speed up the process.



The island offers sufficient drinking water. If you bring bottles, consider filling them after you arrive so your luggage stays lighter.



Depending on the tide level, the walkway leading to the dock can become very steep (up to about 30°), which may make it harder to move your luggage.



On the island, a limited number of wheelbarrows are available to help you carry your luggage to your accommodation. During busy periods, you may need to wait before using one. They are reserved for cabin guests and Plage campers only.



Carefully planning your luggage lets you begin your trip without stress or extra clutter. Think about what you will really need during your stay so you pack only what's essential.



Keep your limits in mind when selecting your accommodation. Choose a campsite or cabin according to the walking distance and your gear.
